## **Travel first aid kit checklist**

Planning your next trip - but not sure what to take with you? I have prepared a checklist for you to help you prepare (list not exhaustive).

Pain and/or fever
Paracetamol
☐ Ibuprofen* (additionally for inflammation) *If a fever caused by dengue fever is suspected, do not take ibuprofen and aspirin. In this case, only take paracetamol.
Stomach/intestines and nausea
☐ Medication for diarrhea (charcoal tablets, loperamide)*  *If diarrhea is suspected due to food poisoning or a bacterial cause: charcoal tablets
☐ Medication for constipation (macrogol, bisacodyl)
☐ Electrolyte solution for fluid loss due to diarrhea and vomiting
☐ Medication for nausea and motion sickness
☐ Medication for abdominal cramps (scopolamine)
☐ Medication for flatulence (Simeticon)
☐ Medication for heartburn (Magaldrat gel, Pantoprazole tablets)
Wounds and abrasions
☐ Liquid disinfectant
☐ Wound ointment/cream
☐ Traction ointment
☐ Small scissors and tweezers
☐ Plaster
☐ Gauze
☐ Dressing material (gauze bandages, elastic bandages)
Steri-strips for cuts
☐ Blister band-aids
☐ Disposable gloves

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Miscellaneous
☐ Clinical thermometer! (important; measure your body temperature in the new environment so that you know your "normal" body temperature there)
☐ Eye drops
☐ Nasal spray
☐ Sore throat tablets
☐ Medication for colds and coughs
Malaria prophylaxis (if necessary)
(antibiotics)
Altitude prophylaxis (if necessary)
☐ Thrombosis prophylaxis
☐ Water purification tablets
☐ Magnesium for muscle cramps
Probiotics (intestinal flora)
Anti-inflammatory ointment (diclofenac, comfrey)
Disinfectant and disinfectant wipes
Deworming medication (mebendazole)
Personal medication
Insect and tick repellent
☐ Insect/tick repellent

Gel/roll-on for insect bites
Sun protection
